## THE LIFE OF THE CHRISTIAN

The Christian church year is divided in two. The first half of the year, we focus on the life of Christ and the key events that took place. In Advent, we anticipate his come at Christmas. In Epiphany, we celebrate that he is the Savior of the world! Lent prepares us with repentance for Good Friday and Easter. The church year culminates with Pentecost when the Holy Spirit empowered the original believers to be witnesses.

The second half of the church year - the portion that we are about to enter into - focuses on the life of the Christian. Now that we've reviewed Christmas, Easter and Pentecost, what does that mean? What habits should be repented of and stopped, and what godly virtues will I now pursue? To what Christian initiatives will we devote our energies? Your notice that Sunday service themes, hymns, prayers and sermons will sound different. The emphasis changes from Christ's life for us to our life for Christ.

This summer Redeemer will again be offering a summer sermon series to spur on personal, spiritual growth. A portion of Galatians 5 will be our focus, particularly the fruits of the Spirit:

- The Fruit of the Spirit is Gentleness
- The Fruit of the Spirit is Self-Control

At the recent Voters' Meeting, the voters approved changing the church fiscal year to run from October through June. This means that the Annual Voters' Meeting will be held in September. This change will provide the opportunity to increase the fidelity of the budgeting process because the school enrollment for the current school year will be established and the health insurance costs for the coming year will also be known.

Wow! The end of the 2014-2015 school year is here. God has richly blessed Redeemer with the privilege of sharing His Word with a wonderful group of students and their families. It is our prayer that God continues to grant this wonderful blessing to us year after year. Thank you to all that you do to support the ministry of Redeemer.

The campus will be a bit quieter in the next couple months, but there will still be a lot going on behind the scenes. It is now time to gear up for the 2015-2016 school year. Right now we have 93 students enrolled for the school year in kindergarten through 8th grade, and we have 46 enrolled in preschool. Typically these numbers increase as we get closer to the school year. It is exciting to see God blessing our numbers like this, as we get ready to share God's Word with this group of students next year.

This summer the teachers will spend some time developing our own learning. All of the teachers will be spending time learning more about technology. We will learn more about our Starboards (interactive whiteboards), Chromebooks, and how to make a classroom website. This training is provided for by Title funds from the Marana Unified School District. We will also learn about writing Individual Education Plans or IEPs for our students with special needs. This class will be taught by Mrs. Amy Mueller. Miss Stahl will be going to Wisconsin for a leadership conference run by the WELS. Miss Seitz will be taking a course on Behavioral and Emotional Disabilities through MLC. I also will be taking a course from MLC on administrative leadership.

## ANNUAL VOTERS' MEETING

Last year the voters agreed to push the annual meeting from April to June. The purpose was to allow better information to be gathered to support budget projections.

After some trial and error, the Elders determined that the information related to preschool and school enrollment was still questionable. So, they recommended to the voters on May 3 to push the fiscal year forward one quarter. Instead of July 1 - June 30 (with annual meeting in June), the recommendation was an October 1 - September 30 fiscal year (with the annual meeting in September.) That would allow us to have accurate preschool and school enrollment information to make budget plans. **The voters approved the idea; our new fiscal year is October 1 - September 30.**

That means a couple of things:

- No annual meeting in June
- Terms of office are extended 3 months
- No new budget; all previously budgeted items extended for 3 months.
- Annual meeting with elections and budget scheduled for September

The Elders will likely present a budget sometime in August and schedule an open forum for further discussion.


