GREEN PARAMENTS

Many parishioners have noted the beautiful new green paraments that adorn the chancel of our church. The term “paraments” refers to the colorful handmade cloths that are placed on the altar, pulpit/ambo, and worn around the pastor’s neck. These paraments are not merely decorative. Their colors and symbols communicate the Gospel we believe. Here is a brief explanation.

Season of Pentecost

From Advent through Pentecost the church remembers the life and work of Christ. However, after Jesus ascends into heaven and sends the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, we spend the Sundays following Pentecost (from May through November) focusing on the life of the Christian. The color for these Sundays is green, referring to the always growing, fed and nourished nature of the believer who seeks to follow Jesus.

Altar Cloth

Our new altar cloth is called a “superfrontal” because it stretches all the way across the front of the altar. The first image refers to baptism with a picture of a shell and drops of water. The middle image is Bible on top of a cross, meaning Jesus is the center of the Bible. It also contains the image of a vine, a reference to John 15:5. The rightmost image pictures holy communion with a chalice and host, superimposed on a cross. The three symbols together teach the means of grace. We grow in faith through the Gospel in Word(middle image) and sacraments (baptism left and communion right).

Stole

The proper name for the cloth the minister wears around his neck is called a "stole." The symbol on the stole is that of a baptism shell, indicating the minister is also a sinner who was forgiven in baptism and made God's child. The stole also contains an image of a flame of fire. That calls to mind the festival of Pentecost, when the disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and what looked like tongues of fire danced on their heads. This pastor is God's baptized servant, filled with the fire of the Holy Spirit to serve God's baptized people with his Word.

**Pulpit/Ambo**

The place from which the pastor preaches is often called a "pulpit" or an "ambo." Paul mentioned to the Corinthians that "I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified" (1 Corinthians 2:2). That would explain why the symbol on the ambo is a bold Greek cross, proudly connecting Jesus with the message spoken from the pulpit. Also symbolized is the green growing vine. Spiritual growth flows from a connection with Christ (John 15:5).



We devote these cloths and symbols to the glory of God, and pray they are a blessing to our congregation. May they always remind us of Jesus, and point us to the way we stay near him through faith!




