FORGET THE SHEEP

You know that old song about counting your blessings instead of sheep? It's not based on the Bible, but it certainly reflects what the Bible says about prayer. Too much of our life is spent listening to others whining about their lot in life and interrupting conversations with our own list of complaints.

St. Paul had a different approach. *"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!" (Philippians 4:4)*. His encouragement takes on even more meaning for us when we consider the circumstances under which the apostle wrote it. Falsely accused, sitting in a Roman jail, waiting endlessly for a trial date, he faced an uncertain future.

Paul's attitude and approach to life is a template for our prayer life. Having Jesus in the heart compels the believer to make thanksgiving the theme of his prayers. Paul goes on to explain: *"The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God (Philippians 4:6)*.

So, forget about counting sheep. You will fall asleep a lot faster and sleep better if you focus on God's blessings. Our innate self-interest tempts us to make our prayers nothing but a "gimme!" list. We think of all the

things we don't have. But when Jesus taught about prayer, he steered us in a different direction. We don't have to focus our prayers on our perceived needs, Jesus said, *"For your Father knows what you need before you ask him" (Matthew 6:8)*.

Certainly, we may bring our many requests to God in prayer, but we will do with the same kind of balance Jesus taught in the Lord's Prayer. Six of the seven petitions in that prayer are requests for spiritual things, for growth in faith, for the spread of the Gospel, for forgiveness of sins, and for strength in the face of temptation.

Jesus and his many blessings give us perspective. We see life from a different point of view than the ungodly do. We have our eyes to the skies. We see God and the final victory over all the frustrating evils of this world. Paul writes, *"I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us" (Romans 8:18)*. So this November, while the pagans will be thankful for all their earthly toys, we will be thankful for our heavenly joys.

Forget the sheep. Think Jesus when you pray, and count your blessings.

Note: We are often asked why we do not advertise this in the community at large. We do not want dealers or second-hand sellers to come and take all the best items and make a profit from them. This is not a fund-raiser. This is a social event and option for those who might be in need. It is a bonanza for people who love to go to yard sales!!!!



On November 3rd and 4th, the teachers will attend the Arizona-California District Teachers' Conference at Shepherd Lutheran School in Albuquerque, NM. This conference is a great opportunity for teachers to refresh spiritually, professionally, and physically. Conference presentations will include reports from the District President, Pastor Jon Buchholz, WELS Commission on Lutheran Schools, and a number of other WELS ministry organizations. On Thursday, Pastor Phil Huber, will lead our Spiritual Presentation entitled, "Let Children Hear the Mighty Deeds: Using Lutheran Schools for Outreach." On Friday, we will hear a keynote presentation entitled, "Embracing Disruption: A Quest to Serve All God's Children" by Shaun Luehring. Finally, there will be plenty of time for fellowship with other brothers and sisters in Christ who are also serving our Heavenly Father in the teaching ministry.

In October we enjoyed a wonderful week that we call "Book Week." The students were challenged to read 45,000 minutes in two weeks, and they accomplished this goal. It is great to see so many students spending time reading. Many told me that they were reading more than ever and spending less time watching tv and playing video games. Hopefully, this will create some long term habits of reading more and more. We also spent an evening at Barnes and Nobel and the students were able to highlight their talents in art, singing, and instrumentals. We had a fantastic week, and we thank all of you who participated.



Last month, I told you a little bit about my visit to a school in Phoenix to help with their accreditation program. I would like to tell you a little bit more about accreditation. The accrediting agency is called Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod School Accreditation (WELSSA). WELSSA is a member of National Council for Private School Accreditation (NCLSA). This makes the accreditation through WELSSA a nationally recognized accreditation. WELSSA has the following three objectives. The WELSSA has been developed to 1. Assist WELS congregations with evaluating their early childhood ministries, Lutheran elementary schools, and Lutheran high schools based on Scripture and on sound educational principles. 2. Provide WELS congregations with a basis for developing a plan for improving their school by identifying strengths and discovering areas in need of improvement. 3. Provide a means by which WELS schools can



become accredited through a nationally recognized agency. I will continue to share information about WELSSA and Redeemer's goal of becoming accredited.

In September and October, I lead the Sunday Morning Bible Class through the topic "Building Youth Ministry from the Ground Up." We discussed the importance of youth ministry, the balance in responsibility, and the balance in purpose of youth ministry. YOUR CHURCH LIBRARY & RESOURCE CENTER

Some have asked me about the distinction between “library” and “resource center”. The library has books available for check-out that you can read and return. The resource center has books available for you to purchase. Most of these books are new, but there are some used books, as well.

In the library we have two new books available for check-out. *The Biotic Message: Evolution vs. Message Theory* by Walter James Remine. This is a very thoughtful book on evolution. The author shows how evolution is an illusion that is perpetuated by dogmatic evolutionists who jump from one mode of explanation to the next in order to deceive critics. He uses the evolutionists own arguments to defeat the theory of evolution.

Also available for check-out is *Patient Parenting: Raising Your Kids in the Shadow of the Cross* by John Juern. Dr. Juern is a Christian psychologist whose articles on godly parenting have been published in *Lutheran Parenting Magazine*. The author deals with a wide array of issues; childhood depression, ADHD, and discipline to name a few. He also addresses parenting behaviors that affect childhood development such as divorce, arguing,

and emotional outlets.

The resource center has five copies left of Pastor Wayne Mueller’s book on Revelation. Attending his Tuesday Evening Bible Class has been so insightful and encouraging. The book of Revelation was written to encourage the believer in times of trials, persecutions, and storms of life. It’s not too late to join the class.

We also have one copy of *The Proper Distinction between Law and Gospel* by C.F.W. Walther. Pastor Adam Mueller teaches this class on Thursdays and what a blessing it has been. It is not always easy to distinguish between the two and learning to know whether to apply the law or the gospel first when talking to an individual is so important. This book will truly be an aid to you.

Come in and have a look at what is on our shelves to encourage you and your children in your Christian walk.

I will be ordering books for Christmas soon so come in, browse my catalog, and put in your order early.


The children at Redeemer Lutheran School and Sunday School will be leading the congregation in worship on December 22nd in a Children's Christmas Program.


"From Heaven Above to Earth I Come," which tells the Christmas message as found in Luke chapter 2.




